Beginnings ...

In 1850, two young German teachers made a decision that would touch the lives of many people.

Hillegonde Wolbring and Elizabeth Kuhling began a community of new Sisters dedicated to caring for and educating the poor. Elizabeth became Sister Maria Aloysia and Hillegonde was called Sister Maria Ignatia.

As Sisters of Notre Dame, they began their work in Coesfeld, Germany and developed the Community. Then in 1874, nine Sisters immigrated to the United States. There they staffed schools and one orphanage in Cleveland, Ohio. Gradually, the Community grew and expanded their services to the poor.

By 1924, there were three large groups of Sisters: one in Kentucky and two in Ohio – in Toledo and Cleveland. Soon after, eleven pioneer Sisters of Notre Dame moved to Los Angeles, California from Cleveland, Ohio and formed the California Province. Today, there are about 600 Sisters of Notre Dame in the United States and hundreds more working in seventeen countries in Europe, Asia, Africa, Central and South America.

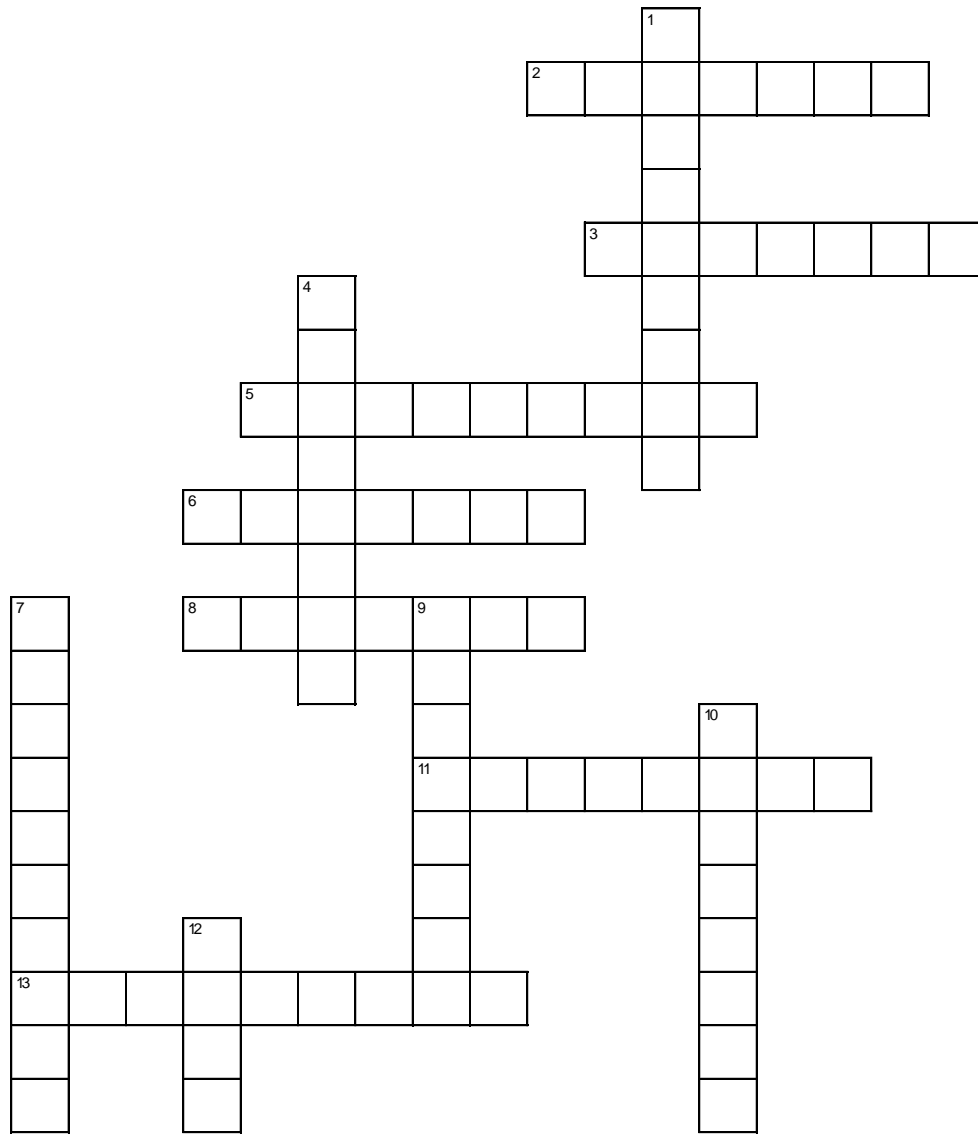
