CELEBRATING EXCELLENCE

For the fifth consecutive year **Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School** (Chardon, OH) and for the fourth consecutive year **Julie Billiart Schools** (OH) have been named winners of the Top Workplaces Award by Cleveland's newspaper, *The Plain Dealer*. 


CELEBRATING EXCELLENCE

Assessment for Sponsored Ministries

The Assessment for Sponsored Ministries was launched in 2022-2023. Six of our sponsored ministries completed the process by engaging members of their community in discussions and reflections on the ways in which Catholic identity and mission are central to the work they do and the culture of their communities. The Assessment for Sponsored Ministries reviews five "domains" or characteristics necessary for Catholic identity and mission effectiveness within each ministry sponsored by the Sisters of Notre Dame. These domains are Charism in Action; Mission and Vision; Leadership and Collaboration; Transformative Education and Care; and Stewardship and Sustainability.

The assessment process enables a sponsored ministry to quantify, with evidence, its alignment with each domain. Through conversations and reflections that occur as a ministry completes the assessment, it will identify and affirm ministry practices as well as surface areas of potential growth or improvement. The process should facilitate strategic planning for continuous improvement in mission effectiveness, Catholic identity, and sustainability. The results are presented to the SND National Ministry Corporation Board. This year seven more ministries will engage in the process.

We have the responsibility to ensure ministries that are viable and reflect the mission and charism of the Sisters of Notre Dame well into the future. We must plan for the reality of a time when the sisters are no longer able to actively participate in our ministries.

HAPPY SND FOUNDATION DAY!






Annual Sponsored Ministry Leadership Gathering


Sponsored Ministry board chairs and members, presidents, principals and other ministry leaders along with the National Ministry Corporation Board and SND Leadership Team gathered for the annual Sponsored Ministry Gathering, *Leadership in Catholic Ministry: Grace and Possibilities,* at Lial Renewal Center in Whitehouse, OH in October.

The keynote speaker was Chris Lowney, board chair of CommonSpirit Health, America's largest nonprofit health system, one-time Jesuit seminarian, Managing Director of JPMorgan & Co. on three continents, and author. His presentation, *Great Leadership in a VUCA World*, discussed leadership in a world of volatility, uncertainty, complexity, and ambiguity. Participants were provided Lowney's book, *Pope Francis: Why He Leads the Way He Leads*, to help frame the presentation and ensuing discussions.

Continuing the leadership theme, Sr. Leanne Hubbard presented sessions on Discernment in Leadership and Community Discernment. Sr. Joanne Keppler shared the *Formation for Sponsored Ministry* program. Tours of local ministries were offered, including Notre Dame Academy and Maria Early Learning Center in Toledo and Lial Catholic School in Whitehouse.

Almost 50 participants, the largest sponsored ministry leadership gathering to date, also enjoyed Mass with the sisters at the Whitehouse SND Center, lively discussion, and thoughtful prayer and reflection.





Sponsored Schools Professionals Network on Zoom

The National Sponsorship and Network Office hosted a Zoom meeting in October bringing marketing and admissions colleagues together across the SND network to discuss topics relevant to their specific areas of responsibility and expertise. Rural Healthcare Student Experience



This past June, four students from Notre Dame Cathedral Latin School in Chardon, OH; three students each from Notre Dame Academy in Park Hills, KY and Toledo, OH; and two students from Notre Dame Academy in Los Angeles, CA along with five chaperones participated in the second year of the Rural Healthcare Student Experience at St. Claire HealthCare in Morehead, KY. Students and chaperones stayed at the Hampton Inn in Morehead and enjoyed a great learning experience and memorable camaraderie with each other.



Improvements to the previous summer's experience included more time shadowing home healthcare, hospice and hospital providers. The students also performed community service by boxing and distributing food at the Elliott County Christian Community Center for a half day. The week concluded with a presentation on physician assistant opportunities and a clinical skills lab including suturing and dissection.



The students celebrated Mass at Jesus Our Savior Parish and enjoyed activities including movie night; a barbecue supper; swimming, playing cards and ice breaker games at the hotel; and dinner and discussion with Don Lloyd at his home, where he presented students and chaperones with custom jackets embroidered with the St. Claire HealthCare and SND logos.







A follow-up Zoom meeting for students with representatives from St. Claire took place in August to discuss considerations for health professions education and included information on nursing and pre-med pathways and the National Health Service Corps loan forgiveness opportunities. Plans are underway for the Third Annual RHSE tentatively scheduled for June 16-20, 2024.
