FY 24 Annual Report

The Sisters of Notre Dame legacy is built on their commitment to meeting the needs of the times. Since their founding in 1850, these needs have continually changed and evolved, and the sisters have done the same in meeting those needs with great love and care. Today the needs of the times are driven by the declining number of sisters in the congregation and the need to transition all ministries to lay leadership and governance. The work of the National Sponsorship and Networking Office (NSNO) is focused on this overarching goal. In that way we honor and advance the 175-year SND legacy.

On July 1, 2024, the NSNO marked its 4th year of operations as part of the SND USA governance structure established in July 2020. Since that date, the office has continued to work with each of our sponsored ministries as they advance their mission and embrace their future in the face of many challenges and opportunities. This work is coordinated with the leadership and guidance of the National Ministry Corporation (NMC) Board including the work of NMC liaisons with each ministry. In this past year, NSNO and the NMC continued to focus on:

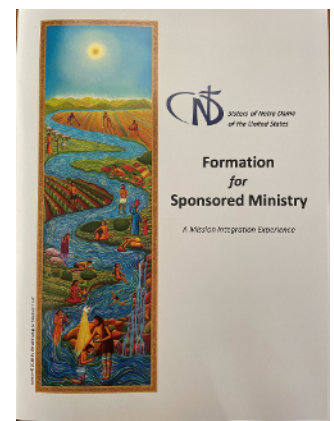
- sharing knowledge of our SND legacy and mission with our lay leaders
- achieving an embedded understanding of SND sponsorship and its significance to governing and leading to ensure a viable future for the ministry
- promoting accountability for Catholic identity and mission

With changing times and the multiple new challenges for many of our ministries, governing boards and leaders face difficult decisions in ensuring future sustainability for mission. We applaud the board and ministry leaders for their dedication to mission and vision.

Accountability to the NMC for mission and Catholic identity promotes the future sustainability for our ministries and supports the full transition to lay leadership. This year marked the second year of implementation for the Assessment for Sponsored Ministries, and 10 of the ministries have now completed this process. The NSNO and NMC also held annual report meetings with each ministry that included discussions of best practices that promote effective governance.

A significant accomplishment this year was the completion of the *Formation for Sponsored Ministry* program design and booklet. The program was introduced at the annual leadership gathering, and Sr. Joanne Keppler also implemented the program with the NMC board as a template for implementation with our ministry boards.

The office continued to provide operational support to the NMC Board in their governance role as the sole member of each ministry. This included gathering financial data and other measures of performance and accountability for each ministry, sharing best practices for leadership and governance with each ministry, planning NMC board meetings, and facilitating communications between the NMC and the ministries.



The annual leadership gathering in October 2023, *Leadership in Catholic Ministry: Grace and Possibilities*, was an opportunity to promote an understanding of leadership in an uncertain world and featured keynote speaker Mr. Chris Lowney, renowned author, public speaker and leadership consultant. Sessions focused on topics related to the challenges and opportunities we face in leading Catholic ministries and the value of personal and community discernment in addressing these as leaders.

An important priority was to continue to develop relationships and collaborate with SND USA national offices to promote the SND mission. This led to positive outcomes that helped promote understanding of roles and the work of the office with sponsored ministries and supported special projects to promote mission.

The future of mission lies in the transition to lay leadership in our ministries and on our boards. Our lay leaders have welcomed the opportunity to be collaborators on this mission journey. It is vital and urgent that we continue to ensure the Catholic identity and integration of our SND sponsor's charism and mission for those leaders.

National Ministry Corporation

The NMC Board members represent all four regions of SND USA and each serves as the liaison to one, two or three sponsored ministries. Bruce Jarosz is the board chair; Sr. Carol Gregory vice chair; and Sr. Pat Garrahan, secretary. Members include Nancy Coonis, Jane Meier, Sr. Mary Ethel Parrott, and Sr. Mary Frances Taymans. The NMC Board held its annual meeting and retreat at St. Joseph Heights (Covington, KY) in late September 2023. The board furthered its focus and objectives in working to promote Catholic identity and mission in SND in self sustaining sponsored ministries. One of the outcomes of the annual retreat was the statement on sponsorship. Sr. Joanne Keppler presented an overview of the *Formation for Sponsored Ministry* program that was implemented with the NMC Board throughout the year.

National Ministry Corporation Sponsorship Statement Excerpt

What is Sponsorship?

- Sponsorship is a structured relationship between ministries and the Catholic Church. The sponsor, authorized by and in the name of the Church, directs and influences the sponsored ministry which exists to meet an apostolic need and further the mission of Jesus.
- Sponsorship is defined by the reserved powers held by the National Ministry Corporation Board (NMC), which are outlined in each sponsored ministry's Code of Regulations/Bylaws.
- The Sisters of Notre Dame (SND) relate with the sponsored ministries directly through the NMC and the National Sponsorship and Network Office (NSNO). This represents a major shift in the role of the laity in the Church. In passing on the charism, mission, and legacy to lay leadership, the Sisters of Notre Dame provide support and services through the NSNO. These services focus on guiding principles, assessment and formation processes, professional development, and networking opportunities.

Self-sustaining ministries:

- The goal for Sisters of Notre Dame sponsored ministries is for each to be fully self-sustaining in Catholic identity, mission, financial resources, governance, and leadership.
- To provide guidance, support and formation the Sisters of Notre Dame have invested in the NSNO and the NMC at no cost to the ministries. The NSNO provides Catholic identity and mission integration resources, board development guidance, and networking opportunities. The NMC provides financial analysis to promote sustainability and best practice suggestions to promote strong governance.

Sponsored Ministries Updates

Ministry Transitions

La Reina High School & Middle School Governing Board resolved to close the school on January 23, 2024 effective June 30, 2024. On January 24, school president Tony Guevara, Laura Koehl and Nancy Coonis announced the board's decision to close the school to the faculty and staff. A letter to all stakeholders followed.

Notre Dame College (NDC) announced its closure on February 29, 2024. Sponsorship by the SNDs had ended in February of 2023. The college was founded by the Sisters of Notre Dame in 1922. Since that time, numerous sisters have graduated from the school, and many have served as faculty and staff members, administrators and board members. The NDC mission and legacy live on in so many, including all of those dedicated sisters and the many communities and people they have served.

On April 26, St. Claire HealthCare (Morehead, KY) entered into an expanded partnership with the University of Kentucky, a collaboration that will ensure St. Claire can continue its 60-year tradition of servicing the healthcare needs of the people of Eastern Kentucky. As part of the agreement, St. Claire established a \$30-million community foundation dedicated to funding projects that continue the SND mission in the local area. The new SND Eastern Kentucky Foundation is a sponsored ministry under the SND National Ministry Corporation and held its first board meeting on June 19, 2024. Officers of the foundation are Sr. Marla Monahan, chair; Sr. Judine Lambert, treasurer; and Ben Caudill, secretary.

Julie Billiart in Westlake, OH opened August 25, 2023, with 44 students in kindergarten through 2nd grade. The Most Reverent Edward Malesic, Bishop of the Diocese of Cleveland, celebrated Mass before blessing and dedicating the school's *Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception Chapel* in September. The JBS board also completed plans to open a new school in Brecksville, Ohio in August of 2024.



Other transitions include Notre Dame Academy Los Angeles announced plans to open an all girls middle school in the fall of 2024 (NDA President Lilliam Paetzold presented this plan and information to the SNDs at the Thousand Oaks Center to keep them informed of these changes); the Notre Dame Academy (OH) board approved the new addition of a front entrance as part of the *Empowering Women - Transforming Lives* campaign as well as a new strategic plan; and St. Charles Community Center (Covington, KY) welcomed 34 SNDs from the Covington Region as new residents.

Leadership Transitions

After eight years serving as Assistance Principal (2016-2020) and Head of School (2020-2024), Lynn Cherry resigned from Lial Catholic School (Whitehouse, OH) effective June 30, 2024. Ms. Cherry has given years of loving service and dedication to Lial as an outstanding teacher and leader and impacted the lives of many with her mission-centered leadership. Following a national search, Mr. Christian Mocek was appointed Head of School effective June 1, 2024. Mr. Mocek brings a solid record as a leader with experience in school advancement, strategic planning, and donor engagement having served as president at Reitz Memorial High School in Evansville, Indiana.

In December, Dr. Jacqueline Hoynes was appointed as President of Notre Dame Schools (Chardon, OH) after serving as principal of Notre Dame Elementary and Middle Schools since 2020 and Interim President of Notre Dame Schools in 2023. Dr. Hoynes brings an extensive career as an educator, superintendent and school leader who has a sincere admiration for the SND mission.

Trish Miller, President of Notre Dame Academy (Park Hills, KY) resigned her position and Jane Kleier, the school's chief communications officer, is serving as the school's interim president while the school searches for a permanent replacement. Jack VonHandorf serves as the principal.

Annual Meetings and Reports

Ministries present their annual reports to the NSNO and NMC liaison. Written reports were received by June 30, and annual report meetings were scheduled throughout the spring and summer.

Mission Assessments

The Assessment of Sponsored Ministry is now in its second year of implementation. This year assessments were received from Notre Dame Academy and Maria Early Learning Center (Toledo, OH), Lial Catholic School (Whitehouse OH) and Notre Dame Learning Center Preschool (Thousand Oaks, CA).

Programs



The third annual Rural Health Student Experience (RHSE) welcomed two students from both Notre Dame Academy in Los Angeles, CA and Park Hills, KY; three students from Notre Dame Academy in Toledo, OH; four students from Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School in Chardon, OH; and four chaperones to Morehead, KY for a week of shadowing health care professionals at St. Claire HealthCare (SCH).

Students participated in skills labs including suturing; fetal pig dissection; and, new this year, virtual reality healthcare simulation. Students also participated in a half day of community service at Rowan County Christian Social Services, a food and clothing distribution center, and dinner at the home of SCH CEO Donald Lloyd and his wife Monti. Lisa Fredrickson, NSNO, and Sr. Judine Lambert, SCH, plan this yearly program.

Engagements and Presentations

Fifty ministry leaders, the largest gathering to date, participated in the Annual Sponsored Ministry Leadership Gathering at Lial Renewal Center in Whitehouse, OH in October. This year's theme was *Leadership in Catholic Ministry: Grace and Possibilities*. The keynote speaker was Chris Lowney, board chair of CommonSpirit Health (America's largest nonprofit health system), one-time Jesuit seminarian, Managing Director of JPMorgan & Co. on three continents, and author. His presentation "Great Leadership in a VUCA World" discussed leadership in a world of volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity. Continuing the leadership theme, Sr. Leanne Hubbard presented sessions on Discernment in Leadership and Community Discernment, and Sr. Joanne Keppler shared the *Formation for Sponsored Ministry* program.

The office assisted in this year's Charism Experience held in March at Bethany Retreat Center in Chardon, OH led by Sr. Lisa Novak and Sr. Donna Paluf with 22 participants representing a diversity of ministries from all four regions.

In person interactions and discussions with sponsored ministry boards were a priority this year including regular meeting and board retreats. Dr. Koehl and Sr. Joanne Keppler held a welcome and information session via Zoom on September 21, 2023 for the five incoming board chairs. They also held two New Board Member Welcome and Information sessions via Zoom in November.

Two SND Network Zoom meetings were held bringing professionals across the network together to discuss relevant topics and share strategies. The first Zoom was held in October with marketing and admissions professionals. A Zoom with campus ministry professionals was held in February and included presentations by Ann Clark, Co-Director of Justice, Peace, and Integrity of Creation; Sr. Jenny Zimmerman from Young Adult and Vocations; and Sr. Lisa Novak of SND Mission Effectiveness.

The NSNO also:

- facilitated a meeting for all the sponsored ministry leaders via Zoom on May 12, 2024. Topics of discussion included transitions, NMC updates, Fall Leadership Gathering, and resources among others.
- provided a document for guidance on working with the LGBTQ+ community, which was shared with the ministries in February.
- facilitated the creation of an insurance consortium, which includes nine sponsored ministries.

Resources and Communications

The office produces two newsletters a year with distribution in November and May. The newsletters are sent through Constant Contact to over 500 contacts and continue to get an above industry average open rate of 55%. A hard copy of the newsletter is mailed to approximately 60 ministry leaders.

The Annual Report is distributed electronically in the fall and provided to participants at the Annual Sponsored Ministry Leadership Gathering in the fall. Opens on Constant Contact continue to get an above industry average open rate of 68%.

The NSNO website has been updated with new photos; award recipient lists; refreshed RHSE page; and resources, including videos.

The office regularly communicates with sponsored ministries and affiliated schools with messages for Catholic School's Week; Catholic Sister's Week; Network Awards Announcements; SND Feast Days; and Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas greetings.

The office produces and distributes a yearly calendar to the ministries to highlight important SND celebration days, national meetings and reminders of when documents and reports are due to the office.

A perpetual calendar with proverbs, bible verses and quotes from St. Julie Billiart, Sr. Maria Aloysia, Fr. Bernard Overberg, and historical figures and a sticker were created to promote the SND history and charism. These items along with bookmarks, booklets, sticky note pads and other stickers are available by contacting the office or visiting the NSNO website.



National Offices Collaboration

The office collaborated with Justice, Peace, and Integrity of Creation Co-Director Ann Clark on the development of videos promoting the centrality of Catholic Social Teaching to our Catholic identity. There are two videos addressing Catholic Social Teaching from the SND perspective and eight videos with SNDs discussing their service in a variety of ministries. The videos can be found on the NSNO website.

Lisa Fredrickson and Dr. Koehl participated in the planning of the SND USA SOAR (Strengths, Opportunities, Aspirations, Results) Summit in Chardon, OH that was held September 11-13, 2023. The summit engaged sisters and lay employees to design a shared vision for the future of SND USA.

Lisa represents the NSNO on the national "Lunch & Learn" committee that organizes opportunities for employees in SND USA to learn more about the mission and ministry of the sisters through presentations hosted in all four regions of SND USA.

The office introduced the SND National Vocation and Young Adult Team to sponsored ministries and affiliated schools via email to promote their work in vocation accompaniment, education, promotion, and response to the spiritual needs of young adults through various programs, activities, resources, and outreach. Ministry and school leaders were encouraged to circulate the email to their faculty and staff with an invitation to subscribe to the Vocation and Young Adult Team's monthly newsletter.

Network Awards

The National Network Awards formally recognize outstanding contributions of SND network employees and volunteers to the achievement of the mission, vision and charism of the Sisters of Notre Dame. They were announced on May honoring 16 employees representing all four regions, sponsored and affiliated schools and healthcare.
